
#### AU HU HUi

## The Wormworld Saga Chapter 2, **The Journey Begins**



#### **Anya's Ghost**

Widely acclaimed as one of the best 10 books of 2011, Anya's Ghost is the first book by Vera Brosgol, a Russian-born American author with a Canadian connection: she's a graduate of Sheridan College in Oakville, Ont. This graphic novel tells the story of a young teenager dealing with the usual trials and tribulations of



her age: body image, friendship, social awkwardness. Anya's personal narrative is complicated by the fact that her family came to America from Russia when she was five, but all Anya wants is to be an all-American girl. Her life is further complicated by the fact that her new BFF is a ghost, with some dark intentions. Beautifully illustrated and written in an engaging tone, the whole package is reminiscent of the Frenchlanguage autobiographical comic Persepolis by Marjane Satrapi. # **GET ME A BLOOMIN'** CUPCAKE!


